

Ibbotson, Henry (1814-1886)



Henry Ibbotson was born at Ganthorpe , near Castle Howard, Yorkshire. He was the son of the gardener, John Ibbotson and his wife, Elizabeth. Richard Spruce (1817–1893) was his contemporary in Ganthorpe ; Spruce went on to become one of the great Victorian explorers in South America (see article at http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Richard_Spruce).




In 1851, the census records Ibbotson as living in **Ganthorpe** with his sister Elizabeth and mother (widowed), and he is described as a ‘botanist’.



In the 1861 census, Ibbotson is recorded as a gardener at Castle Howard Reformatory School (Welburn). He produced [A Guide to Castle Howard](#). Interestingly, some of Mudd’s specimens were collected from **Castle Howard** by Ibbotson:-



He contributed to Henry Baines’ **Flora of Yorkshire** (1840) and to J. G. Baker’s works (who, after Thirsk, worked at Kew). He also prepared and published ‘Rarer plants near Castle Howard’ – *The Phytologist* 1844, p.557 at <http://www.archive.org/stream/phytologistpopul4144luxf#page/100/mode/2up/search/ibbotson>.



<i>Ranunculus Lingua.</i> Bogs near Kirkham.	<i>Stellaria nemorum.</i> Oxcar's wood.
<i>Trollius europæus.</i> Terrington North Carr and in Holly-hill bogs.	— <i>glauca.</i> Boggy ground near the Derwent.
<i>Helleborus viridis.</i> About Mowthorpe and Conesthorpe.	<i>Cerastium arvense.</i> About Terrington and Conesthorpe.

His main work was “A catalogue of the phaenogamous plants of Great Britain”, which came out in parts between 1846 to 1849”, see

His 'last' contribution was probably a booklet / pamphlet on “The ferns of York” in 1884. He sold specimen sets of the rarer plants of the northern counties. The 1881 and 1891 censuses record him variously as a botanist / gardener and lodger / boarder in York.
