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## **About Natstand family documents:**

A Natstand family document is intended to provide background information concerning the family of a deceased naturalist. It is hoped that such information will form a framework which will help interpret their surviving correspondence, specimens and records. In some cases it will also give an insight into the influences on their early lives and the family constraints within which they worked and collected. We have found that published family data concerning individuals rarely contain justification for dates and relationships and not infrequently contain errors which are then perpetuated. The emphasis in Natstand family documents will be on providing references to primary sources, whenever possible, which will be backed-up with transcriptions.

Although a Natstand biography page will always carry a link to a family document, in many cases these documents will be presented without any further biographical material. We anticipate that this will occur if the person is particularly well known or is someone we are actively researching or have only a peripheral interest in.

### **The following conventions are used:**

Any persons in the family tree with known natural history associations will be indicated in red type. Any relationships will be to the root naturalist unless otherwise stated.

Dates are presented Year – Month – Day

e.g. **1820 March 9** or **1820.3.9**  
**1820 March** or **1820.3**

Dates will be shown in bold type if a reliable reference is presented in the document. In cases where an exact year cannot be given (e.g. it is derived from an age at death), the date will be presented in normal type and preceded with "c" – e.g. c1798. There are some cases where a date is available from a secondary source only (e.g. a published obituary), in these cases it will be presented in italics – e.g. *1823.7.21*

### **Data sources:**

Census data have been used, whenever possible, to confirm relationships; they are not considered a reliable source of data concerning age. Contemporary newspaper family notices are considered as reliable sources of relationships and dates; reports and obituaries are treated more cautiously. Parish records generally provide a reliable source of data and digitised images have been used whenever possible. Any difficulties with transcription will be made clear. In some cases only transcripts have been available; errors here are usually confined to spelling. The most important source of this material is the International Genealogical Index compiled by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Utah. National Civil Registration Indexes are considered reliable, as are probate records.

The following document outlines the family relationships of **Charles Bailey** (1838 – 1924) of Manchester; all indicated relationships are relative to him. References to "he", Charles, Charles Bailey or Charles Bailey jun. without further qualification, should be interpreted as meaning Charles Bailey (1838 – 1924). His life and works are well documented but his family origins less so and sometimes inaccurately.

Charles Bailey was the eldest of four sons born to Charles Bailey (1808 - ?) and Mary Elizabeth Eglinton (1811 – 1891). Most authors give his date of birth as 1838 June 14, which would correspond well with his christening in Coventry on July 18; his parents were residing in the Butts area at the time. Charles and his brothers spent most of their working lives in Manchester and all seem to have had successful business careers. Charles became a noted amateur botanist and he served as secretary to the Botanical Exchange Club between 1879 and 1903 (Allen 1986). He assembled a fine and extensive herbarium which he donated to Manchester University in 1917.

His father is a somewhat shadowy figure in the life of Charles and his brothers. The siblings' places of birth and schooling show that the family lived in Coventry, Birmingham, Ditherington (Shrewsbury) and Warrington before settling in Manchester in the 1850s. In the census returns of 1861 and 1871 the boys' mother, Mary Elizabeth, is acknowledged as the head of household although it was not until 1891 that she describes herself as a widow. Charles Bailey sen. is to be found living in small hotels in Warrington (1851) and Bermondsey (1861). The latter being somewhat enigmatic as, superficially, it seems to suggest that Bailey sen. had a son, William Morley, who had been born in Bermondsey around 1830. Surprising as Charles sen. describes himself as a bachelor when he married in 1837.

Charles Bailey sen. was the youngest child of Charles Bailey (c1773 – 1843), a hatter of Atherstone, Warwickshire. At the time of his marriage Charles Bailey sen. was a currier and had been residing in Dumfries. Although both of Charles Bailey's paternal grandparents died when he was a young child, contact with the family was certainly maintained and Charles acted as executor to his uncle James Bailey (1803 – 1893), an unmarried Land Agent of Warwick. In 1891 a death notice of Mary Elizabeth Bailey appeared in the Manchester Courier where she was described as "*widow of the late Charles Bailey of Atherstone*".

Charles's mother, Mary Elizabeth, was the eldest child of grocer John Eglinton of Ashbourne, Derbyshire, and his wife Elizabeth née White. In 1827 John ingested a large amount of poison, leaving a widow and nine children. Several of John's children eventually gravitated towards London where Charles's uncle William established a successful printing and stationery business.

[The form shows divisions between the first three, implying that they were occupying a room each. Wilton refers to the parish of Hockwold cum Wilton; Thomas may be one of the children of Thomas and Susan Morley, other children of whom were baptised in the parish in the 1810s. Care is needed interpreting this entry as the enumerator may have made mistakes when collating his return. **Thomas Swindell** was baptised in Parwich, Derbyshire on 1808 May 15, the son of George and Sarah. Superficially it would appear that William Morley is Charles Bailey jun.'s older half-brother.]
