FASHIONABLE WEDDING.-On Wednesday, at noon, the Church of St. Peter-le-Bailey was well filled to witness the marriage of the Rev. William Richardson Linton, of Stirtloe, Hunts, son of the Rev. Canon Linton, formerly Rector of St. Peter-le-Bailey, to Alice, eldest daughter of the late Canon W. W. Shirley, D.D., of Christ Church. The first portion of the service was read by the Rector (Rev. F. J. Chavasse), and the Ceremony was performed by the Rev. Canon Capel-Cure, who delivered a short address to the newly-married couple at the conclusion of the service, which was choral. The bride's dress was of cream satin trimmed with Brussels lace, with veil and orange blossoms. The bridesmaids, five in number, were dressed in stylish costumes of red cashmere trimmed with plush, and plush bonnets, with shoes and gloves to match. The present from the bridegroom to each of the bridesmaids was a silver locket and chain, engraved with the initials of the bride and bridegroom entwined. The wedding breakfast was held at the house of the bride's mother, adjoining the Church, and was provided by Mr. Boffin. The cake and favours came from Messrs. Gunter, of London. The happy couple started for their honeymoon about four o'clock, their destination being Rome. The presents were numerous, and were mostly of a useful character.

OBITUARY. The Right Rev. Sydney Linton, D.D., Bishop of Riverina, died Tuesday, after a brief illness. Dr. Linton was a son the Rev. Henry Linton, Rector of St. Peter's le Bailey, Oxford, and Hon. Canon of Christ Church. He was educated at Rugby and at Wadham College, Oxford, where he graduated and took a second class in law and history in 1864. He was ordained deacon in 1867, and priest in 1868. He was Curate St. Mark's, Cheltenham, from 1867 to 1870; Vicar of Holy Trinity, Oxford, from 1870 to 1877; and Vicar of St. Philip's, Norwich, from 1877 to 1884. In the latter year, on the formation of the See of Riverina he was appointed the first Bishop.

The will of Harriet Louisa Munby, widow, late of Glendale, ashford, Middlesex, died 17 April, was proved by Florence Emily Cock (her daughter) and Henry Venn Scott, gentleman.

1928 February 33: Probate

Records that the reverend Edward Francis Linton of Offwell 14 St. Catherine's-road Southbourne Hampshire died 9 January 1928: Probate to Winifred Linton spinster and Ernest Edward Bird solicitor.

1931 July 9: Probate

Death of Jane Isabella Linton at Oxford on 5 May 1931.

1935 March 27: Probate

The will of Mary Louisa Linton, late of Stirtloe House, Buckden, Hunts, died 20 february, was proved by her son HenrLinton (retired captain H.M. army) and Edmund Hardy Vernon, solicitor.

The will of Mary Sophia Linton, widow, late of Southbourne, Hampshire, died on 14 November 1939, was proved in London by rev. Bishop Martin Linton Smith [her nephew] and Ernest Edward Bird, solicitor.

¹ Sydney Linton was the first bishop of Riverina, Australia.

² Australian press reports record that he arrived in Australia with his wife and four children, death reports state that he had a family of six children. This is confirmed by his widow's statement in the 1911 census of England where she records that all of her six children are still alive.

³ The Rev William Miles Myres was the incumbent of St Peter's, Preston, Lancs., to which Edward Francis Linton was appointed curate in 1871. On 19 April 1873 Rev Mires married Mary Elizabeth, the third daughter of the late Rev. George Weight; Edward Frances Linton married her younger sister in 1876.

⁴ Mary Sophia Gray was the daughter of Rev. John Durbin Gray (c1822 – 1887) and had a twin brother Reginald, later of Burford, Ontario. The botanist Rev. John Durbin Gray (1845 – 1925), vicar of Nayland, was her eldest brother.
